# How Many were Killed?

The local history books give a figure of 355, but do not list the details. The Friends earlier publications only state 347. The recently published Commonwealth war graves Commission have released 345, but one seems to be a duplicate. This publication makes use of the list supplied by the CWGC. We have managed, so far, to locate 207 of these in Cathays.

# First Casualties - San Felipe

On a sunny afternoon of 9 July 1940 a lone German bomber was heard over Grangetown, which then turned towards Cardiff Docks. The British Steamer SS San Felipe, loaded with timber, had taken a direct hit in the hold, killing 7 men.

Casualties included: Jeremiah Savage 61 Western Cemetery H1221; John Wellington Palmer 60 Western Cemetery H278; James McCarthy 49; Denis Feehan 55 Cathays Plot R4040; Joseph Thomas Kane 39 Cathays Plot EH 2257

A docksman Tim O'Brien, became a hero as he entered the smoke-filled hold and loaded the fatally wounded Jeremiah Savage into a tub. Both men were hauled to safety, but the crewman died later. Tim went back into the hold on two more occasions, to attempt rescues. He was awarded an industrial medal for his bravery.

Another man, J N Anderson also jumped onto the vessel to attempt to rescue crew members.

## Pembroke Dock

On the afternoon of Monday 19<sup>th</sup> August 1940, a lone German raider dropped a number of bombs on the government-owned oil tanks at Pennar on the east side of Pembroke. One hit a storage tank which burst into flame, causing one of the largest infernos in Wales. Men of the Auxiliary Fire Service from most parts of Wales, Birmingham and Bristol attended the blaze. Five firefighters from Cardiff were killed. Clifford Mills, Brunswick Street; Frederick Davies, Llanbradach Street; Ivor Kilby, Elaine Street & John Frederick Thomas, 16 Elaine Street, Roath (Plot EJ169).

## 2 January 1941 The Worst Day

Incendiary bombs started falling just after the sirens sounded at 6.37 pm in Leckwith Wood, Castle grounds & Sophia Gardens. Bombs were smothered out on the City Hall, but little damage done. Canton Secondary School was hit, Peacocks Bazaar in Queens Street was burnt out. The Corporation Transport Offices in Paradise Place were destroyed. In Grangetown, Hollyman's Bakery & the Gas Works were hit. Scores of people were killed.

Mourners, who had attended a funeral earlier in the day, were gathered together at a house in Blackstone Street, when the bombing began they decided it was safer to remain indoors rather than make a dash for the public shelter. It was a decision that cost 13 of them their lives when a landmine struck the house. Today the maisonettes of Edinburgh Court occupy the site where 3 Blackstone was destroyed. Harold, Lilian & Selina Follant are buried in plot S 1819.

Another 10 people were killed not far away in a single house in Neville Street. All Saints Church in Llandaff North was destroyed. Llandaff cathedral was also hit as was St Michaels College.

The all-clear sounded at 4.50am on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 10 hours after the raid started. 111 German bombers were involved. 165 people were killed and 95 houses totally destroyed.

The bodies of the deceased were laid out in the Chapels at Cathays Cemetery for the Purpose of Identification. Those unidentified or not claimed by relatives by 12 noon on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> January were given a Civic burial at 12 noon on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> January. Not all could be identified and some shared a common grave. The procession of mourners included the Lord Mayor, wearing black crepe on his chain of office, and members of the Corporation. The Bishop of Llandaff led the funeral service.

# Hollyman’s Bakery

Hollyman’s bakery occupied the junction of Stockland Street and Corporation Road in Grangetown. The basement at the rear had been reinforced as a shelter and when the siren sounded people hurried to take cover. Soon after the attack began, a high explosive bomb hit the bakery and 32 people in the basement, including the Hollyman family were killed.

The wardens brought out the human remains they could find and the cellar was filled in. The following four members of the Hollyman Family were buried in plot S 2935 of Cathays Cemetery: Ethel, Joan, Margaret and William.

In 2011 a memorial plaque was placed at 64 Corporation Road.

# Francis Wilberforce Gaccon

Francis Wilberforce Gaccon was born in 1888, the son of Watkin and Alice Charlotte Gaccon and received his engineering training with Guest, Keen and Nettlefolds, of Cardiff. After holding various positions with this firm he joined the staff of Nash's Autocars, Cardiff, and after two years started his own business as Consulting Engineer and Damage Assessor, and subsequently became Assessor to all the leading insurance companies for South Wales, with branch offices in Bristol, Cheltenham, Swansea and Taunton.

By 1901, he was living at 96 Habershon Street, Roath, Cardiff with his parents and brother Evan E C Gaccon. He married Lilian Maud (nee Rodwell), of 153 Cyncoed Road on 11 September 1920, at St Margaret, Roath, Cardiff.

The armistice of the Great War was not signed until 11th November 1918, consequently, the 1918—19 Rugby season was not an official one and those matches played late in the season were to benefit wartime charities. There was however a tour of Britain by the New Zealand Army team which played 13 games in Wales including a match with Cardiff on 29th March 1919 and one with Wales on 21st April. Cardiff, captained by "Frank" Gaccon, drew the match in a no score encounter before a crowd of 10,000. At Swansea the tourists beat Wales by 6 points to three, Frank played, at the time, in the Welsh team.

When war was declared he joined Cardiff Auxiliary Fire Service and became Commander of the Cardiff A.F.S. He was killed by enemy action whilst on duty on 3rd March, 1941 and was 53 years of age. Francis lies buried in Cathays Cemetery in plot M 948a.

## 3 March 1941 The Fire Blitz

The siren at 8.25pm on 3<sup>rd</sup> March 1941 signalled the start of a major raid on Cardiff Docks. Lansdowne Road School and Moorland Road School were set on fire by incendiary bombs. & lines of track and many wagons were blown up in Roath Dock. A bomb hit Mountstuart Dry Dock. Serious damage was done to Spillers mill along with houses in Madoc Road and South Park Road. 46 people died that night. Fire bombs gutted St David's Roman Catholic Cathedral in Charles Street.

## 18 May 1943 The Final Blitz

The Germans used Stuka bombers during a night raid lasting only 83 minutes from 2.36am, dropping 60 high explosives and parachute bombs and hundreds of incendiary bombs. Over 40 people were killed, with 52 seriously wounded and 76 others slightly injured.

Following the railway line from Llanishen Reservoir through Whitchurch, Rhiwbina & the Heath to Queens Street Station and the Docks. Houses were damaged in Pantbach Road, llwynfedw Gardens and Mynachdy Estate. A direct hit on houses in St Agnes Road, killed 6 people; At number 35, Megan Williams (Plot EB600); at number 37 Gwendoline, Herbert & Mary Noble (Plot EI5); and number 41 Beulah & Patricia Batten (Plot EI150).

Three sisters aged between 4 and 11 died together at 29 Frederick Street (Plot EQ1102). At the Dowlais Works, East Moors, a member of the Home Guard was killed, Victor Barnard (Plot EL200).

The Cemetery was closed for 3 weeks after the raid because of damage caused to the area by parachute mines. American troops stationed at Heath Park helped with the clear-up.
