

INTRODUCTION

Whilst photographing and recording the gravestones in Cathays Cemetery, it became apparent that there were many inscriptions on family headstones that included references to war casualties that were buried abroad or were missing from other memorials entirely. As there seemed to be no listing available the Friends took it upon themselves to record these inscriptions along with their locations and any references concerning the deceased.

The product of this research and studies are presented herein, but it seems we are constantly finding further inscriptions and we hope to update this information either on our website or in future publications.
